Programme Overview:

The primary objective of the Diploma in Occupational Health and Safety programme is to provide a recognised qualification for those with a professional interest in, or involved in the application of, occupational health and safety at work. Participants will also have the opportunity to review and prepare safety related documentation and risk assessments for their own workplace.

Programme Outcomes:

On successful completion of this course, participants will be able to:

- Identify relevant hazards and risks in the workplace, advise on and provide for the suitable management practices and policy amendments
- Prepare and complete regular reviews of an organisation's health and safety management system
- Recommend and oversee the implementation of suitable actions to minimise risks
- Investigate accidents, prepare reports, make cost effective proposals to prevent recurrence
- Identify, interpret and describe the main requirements of legislation and codes of practice
- Maintain records and information to advise and prepare all levels of management
- Identify the general concepts of employment law and how this relates to health and safety management
- Identify the nature and extent of occupational illness and accidents impacting on absenteeism and managing absenteeism relating to these
- Prepare, develop and deliver effective communication and training programmes on occupational health and safety
- Outline the general concepts of environmental management.

Approach:

There are a number of activities and case studies as part of the course to ensure that the key knowledge and skills are practiced. The programme is delivered by experienced Ibec Executives who provide members with advice, consultancy and training on a daily basis. Programme participants are encouraged to express their views and experiences. The programme facilitates participant discussion to ensure a thorough understanding of the key points and their application. Real life case studies and exercises will be used to ensure a real practical understanding of each topic.

Assessment Strategy

Participants will be assessed according to the following three criteria:

1. Participants are required to complete two 3,500 – 4,500 word projects. One project is based on the Management of Occupational Health and Safety and the second on the principles of hazard control. Participants will be given a project titles on the subjects. The essays will constitute 40% of the end of year marks.
2. Participants will be required to attend and participate in class and prepare a Learning Diary. This will constitute 10% of the end of year result.
3. Participants will be required to sit an end of year exam on the areas covered during the Diploma. The exam constitutes the remaining 50% of end of year result.

Who Should Attend?

The programme is designed to provide a recognised qualification for those with a professional interest in, or involved in the application of, occupational health and safety at work. Therefore participants are required to be working in the area of Occupational Health and Safety (OHS) or Management, or intending to move into this field.
